#### **£30m Big Lottery Fund for young carers & vulnerable young people**

The Big Lottery Fund has recently announced its £30 million Youth in Focus which will support projects helping young carers and young people leaving care and youth offenders' institutions. Projects should be led by the voluntary sector but it is required to form wider partnerships with public/private bodies. Grants of between £500,000 and £1,000,000 will be available over three to five years. Applications will start in September 2010 after a series of briefing sessions across England. There might be a high demand for these sessions, so book your place well in advance. For the East Midlands, the briefing session will be held in Birmingham on 15 September 2010, 10am-12noon. The deadline for submission of applications is 30 November 2010.

### **The Percy Bilton Charity**

The Percy Bilton Charity offers grants to UK registered charities whose primary objectives are to assist one or more of the following groups:

- Disadvantaged / underprivileged young people aged under 25
- People with disabilities, including physical or learning disabilities or mental health problems

The Charity has two programmes for organisations to apply to:

- Large grants – offering one off payments for capital expenditure of £2,000 and over
- Small grants - offering up to £500 towards furnishings and equipment for small projects. This programme is more suitable for smaller organisations.

There is no set deadline, but Board meetings are held quarterly in March, June, September and December to consider large grants. Applications may be submitted at any time and will be considered at the next appropriate Board meeting. Applications for small grants are considered monthly.

### **Nottingham City Council Reviews Voluntary Funding Programme**

The work of 100 Nottingham voluntary groups supported by the council is to be assessed under a general spending review. Council officials have been asked to initiate cutbacks in services and say they are reviewing the work of local voluntary organisations in receipt of funding to assess how much of an impact they have on people's lives. The council claims it is necessary to find out what social care services are not currently available and compare this with what the local voluntary sector provides.

### **Youth projects lose out on dormant bank account funds**

Dormant bank account assets will no longer be earmarked for young people's projects and will instead be used to fund the coalition government's broader big society agenda. The previous government had pledged that youth work would be a chief beneficiary of an estimated £400m worth of unclaimed assets found through the Dormant Bank and Building Society Accounts Act 2008.

### **Funding for projects affecting children and young people to be slashed**

The government has announced cuts of at least £169.5m to capital funding for a range of projects affecting children and young people, including money for youth facilities, new playgrounds and improved social work IT systems.

The cuts were revealed in a letter from Education Secretary Michael Gove, which was sent to all local authorities this week. Gove claimed that the comprehensive spending review in October would be handled "in a completely different way" to how decisions have been taken on recent cuts. "[The

spending review] will involve consulting widely and making use of all available talents to deliver a stronger society, as well as a smaller state.

### **Prime Minister to launch National Citizen Service pilots for young people**

The Prime Minister will today announce plans for 16 year olds to take part in National Citizen Service (NCS) pilots next summer. Government-backed pilots for the scheme will start next summer and will provide around 10,000 places. Aimed at school leavers aged 16, the pilots will take place from June to September, following the end of the exam period, and will last for seven to eight weeks. NCS aims to give every 16 year old the chance to learn new skills that will help them to make a positive contribution to their community.

### **National Citizen Service Programme Seeks Participants**

Minister for the Cabinet Office Francis Maude opens youth volunteering scheme to applications from charities, businesses and voluntary groups. The National Citizen Service scheme will offer young the opportunity to spend up to seven weeks volunteering after their GCSEs, carrying out a range of activities including residential schemes, community projects and physical events. Cabinet Minister Mr Maude revealed the application process would in the coming weeks and take the form of a competitive tendering programme with successful applicants due to be announced in October.

### **Government to switch off ContactPoint in August**

The ContactPoint database is to be shut down on 6 August, children's minister Tim Loughton has confirmed. Loughton says that the government is still committed to information sharing among children's professionals, particularly those in different council areas, however, a "more proportionate approach" is needed. ContactPoint would have held records on every child, a system that Loughton says was unjustifiable. Any new information-sharing system needs to focus only on the most vulnerable children, he added. The government believes that the existing database is not needed for the development of this alternative system and it will be switched off next month. Guidance has now been issued to councils on ensuring data is protected during the switching off and decommissioning process.

### **Pickles to scrap remaining regional government offices**

Communities Secretary Eric Pickles has announced plans to abolish the remaining eight regional government offices including the East Midlands office. This means Department for Education programmes including Sure Start, Connexions, Positive Activities for Young People and the 14 to 19 reforms will no longer be managed at regional level. Regional performance management and support for children and young people's services will also cease and it is widely thought Local Area Agreements could be scrapped. Arrangements for the closures and for the transfer of any on-going functions will be made at the end of the comprehensive spending review in the autumn, so government office staff will have to wait several months to learn their fate.

### **Youth services told to improve**

Ofsted has published Supporting Young People: An evaluation of recent reforms to youth support services in 11 local areas. The report shows that targeted support from local authorities and their partners is helping to meet the needs of vulnerable young people in England. But it finds that local authorities have made 'limited progress' in involving voluntary, community, and private groups in providing youth services, and the focus on providing services for 'at risk' young people risks undermining the youth activities available to all young people.

### **Apprenticeship academy**

The Co-operative Group has announced a £21m campaign to create a 'cultural shift' in the perception and treatment of young people in the UK, with a new apprenticeship academy at the heart of the campaign. The Co-op group will create 2,000 new apprenticeships over two years as part of its Inspiring Young People programme.
